

WHAT IS: THE SOCRATIC METHOD

The Socratic method, according to the University of Chicago Law School website, is based on the Greek philosopher Socrates. Socrates learned about the views of people around him by asking questions repeatedly until something that was contradictory came up. The contradiction was used as an argument into the fallacy of the initial thought.

The Socratic method is used in many law schools across the country, although it is the least used method of teaching. The Socratic method is used to both question your own knowledge of things as well as think critically (Maxwell 2019).

Law school Socratic method is different from how Socrates used the method, so be sure to keep that in mind when you are looking at Socrates and his method!
